Priority Area #1—Students and teachers are engaged in active, purposeful learning

- Focus on the continued implementation of Readers Apprenticeship throughout the various curriculum areas.
- Incorporate Career Cruising and the Real Game as part of the implementation plan of Middle Years Life/Work Exploration
- Continued implementation of the Classroom Economy Initiative with extension to additional classrooms.
- Ongoing implementation of Math software programs
- Implementation of the Thinking Classroom as presented by Dr. Peter Liljedahl.
- Implementation of Makerspace, a hands on, activity based learning opportunity

Priority Area #2—School Community encourages purposeful and meaningful relationships

- Strong Connections assessments that guide growth and movements along the curriculum
- Continued professional development in the areas of Middle Years Numeracy and Literacy
- Social Justice initiatives that involve more students in hands on experiences within the community such as "Volunteer Week"
- Creating classroom environments that support all learners with furniture placement and arrangement
- Integration of Bring Your Own Device as a learning tool

- Purposeful instruction of digital citizenship using the Canadian Centre for Child Protection and SMART Media
- Continued integration of "Ready to Learn"

SMS is a Grade 5 – 8 middle school with 362 students and a teaching staff of 24. SMS offers five core academic courses and specialty programs including Gr. 7 and 8 Band, Choirs, Industrial Arts and Home Economics, Art, Digital Art, and Drama. Grade 5 and 6 students receive Art, Music and French instruction. All students in Grade 5-8 receive French education. SMS provides student support through resource teachers, guidance counsellors, and 12 educational assistants. SMS partners with HSD Student Services to provide a wide range of clinician services.

SMS offers a full intramural sports program for grades 5-8 before school and during lunch, as well as inter-school sports programs for grades 7 and 8, featuring school teams in volleyball, basketball, badminton, track and field, cross country and soccer. Opportunities have also been established for grade 5 and 6 students to learn skills for interscholastic sports. A Recess Guardian program is in place for the noon hour to make lunch time more meaningful and safer. Students also have opportunity to participate in Special Olympics.

SMS offers opportunities for students to participate in opportunities for student leadership and student voice. Our social justice committee is a student initiated student group formed to address local and global issues focussing on social justice.
